Who is Jean-Claude Colin ?

Jean-Claude Colin was the founder of the Marist Fathers – priests and brothers of the Society of Mary

Born at the close of the 18th century in revolution-torn France, Jean-Claude was convinced that the Blessed Virgin wanted a group of men and women to do her work in the world at a time of turmoil and challenge.

With this inspiration he forged the way for a new

family of consecrated religious and laity in the Church - the Marist family.

Under his leadership, as founder and father, Marist missionaries would proclaim Christ's message in Mary's gentle spirit 'on whatever distant shore' to which they were sent.

Today Marists throughout the world pray that he will become better known and revered. As the Cause for his Beatification is pursued, they seek graces through his intercession for themselves and the people they serve.

Day 8

Then he would pray all the time and have others pray a lot in these intentions.

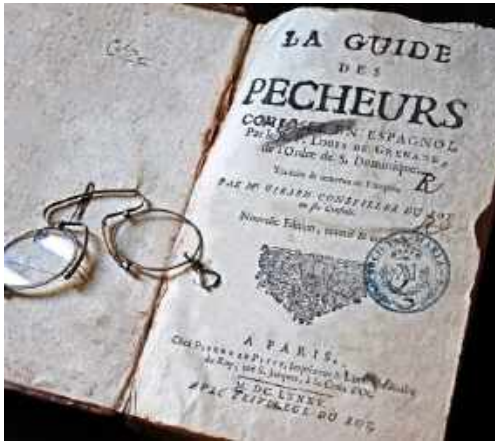
He would study the issue, consult many, but mainly trust in prayer (FA 349, 12).

Those who lived with Colin saw in him a saint but were also well aware of his little failings.

Those little failings helped to keep pride in check. Colin gave way to his timidity and other weaknesses except when it was about the

Society of Mary. Then he would overcome his limitations (FA 235, 24-28)

Living with my limitations and those of others

In this way, liberated from undue self-concern, they will be useful to others and do great things for God, and so the Society will achieve its goals. They leave it to the Lord to say the healing word that brings inner peace and the freedom to serve their neighbour. (n 220)

This Novena

Daily themes drawn from 'A Founder Acts' help us know Jean-Claude Colin better. Extracts from the 1988 Marist Constitutions resonate with these themes and are followed by a prayer to Jean-Claude requesting a particular grace. To this may be added any other prayer or, indeed, a prayer for a miraculous grace.

Miraculous Graces

Miracles are clearly beyond the course of natural events. For the Cause of Jean-Claude Colin to be advanced, a miracle through his exclusive intercession is needed. This novena offers the following prayer for such a miraculous grace:

Loving God, you inspired Jean-Claude Colin to live a life faithful to the Gospel and in the spirit of Mary.

Colin in a niche

A priest said to Father Poupinel standing in St. Peter, Rome, and looking at the empty niche besides Blessed Alphonse Liguori: “Look, the place reserved for your superior!” (FA 218, 1).

Like many others this priest was struck by the look of holiness and simplicity on Colin’s face.

Personal holiness

Mary, as their first and perpetual Superior, inspires them with courage to pursue the aims of the Society: to grow in personal holiness, to work for the salvation of their neighbour, and to keep the faith of the Catholic Church and defend it with all their strength. It is in pursuing these aims in the spirit of Mary that they will help to renew the Church in her image, a servant and pilgrim Church. (n 10)

Venerable Father Founder, at your intercession may God help us to be of the same holiness and simplicity. May we find our niche where God wants us to proclaim the Good News today. Amen.

Day 6

Colin makes decisions

Colin was well-known for being very slow in making up his mind.

The reason? He wanted to be as certain as possible to do God’s will and so gave it time (*Dare Locum Dei*).

But once he came to a decision he implemented it promptly (FA 307).

Spiritual decision making

Unity in the Society and effective action require that its members be consulted and participate in decision-making, and that superiors have a well-defined authority. In this way decisions will be based on accurate information and reflect the needs of the people they serve, and at the same time decisions can be taken with flexibility and promptness. (n. 161)

Venerable Father Founder, at your intercession may God help us to discern and follow the divine will and to put it into practice in our daily life as Jesus did, our Lord. Amen.

Colin in a joyful spirit

Colin said to the students in Belley: ‘Servite Domino in laetitia et exultatione’ – Serve the Lord with gladness and in exultation.

He quoted Saint Francis of Sales who said ‘Les saints tristes sont de tristes saints’ – Saints who are sad are pitiful Saints (FA 395, 2).

Marist spirit a joyful spirit

Marists prefer to be known by their life and their work with the poor and abandoned rather than through publicity. Their joy in belonging to Mary's family and the generosity with which they do her work will attract candidates to join them. (n. 37)

Venerable Father Founder, at your intercession may God give us the holy joy and holy freedom that characterized your life so that we can proclaim the Good News in gladness and joy. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

In his time, people walked a lot and travelled even great distances on foot.

Colin walked the Bugey Mountains. He went on regular walks, and did not mind even trying a sledge on a frozen pond in winter to get exercise (FA 295).

Follow in the footsteps of Jesus Christ

By vowing poverty Marists put their trust in a Father who knows their every need. They choose to be poor to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. Like the first believers, they bring what they have to their brothers, and hold everything in common with them (Cf. Acts, 4:32). (n 106)

Colin had lifelong health issues. Malaria was but one of his conditions (FA 222; 230). He used the available remedies.

Overall, his energy was often interrupted but not paralyzed by illnesses.

Care for one's health

The criteria for admission to the novitiate are determined by the aims and the spirit of the Society. Besides the requirements of Canon 642, the candidate shall have the following qualities: (e) the intelligence, judgement and physical health necessary to enable him to contribute effectively to the mission and apostolates of the Society. (n. 42)

Venerable Father Founder, at your intercession may God give us the faith to deal with sickness and ageing. We also pray for those who care for our sick confreres and for all doctors and nurses. Amen.

Day 4

Colin shows his feelings

In many ways Colin was a very emotional and sensitive person and could easily shed tears both of joy and of mourning.

He gesticulated with his hands, his feelings showed on his face. He tried not to be overcome or determined by his feelings.

After allowing his feelings to show he turned to God in prayer and in praise (FA 216).

Emotional balance required

The criteria for admission to the novitiate are determined by the aims and the spirit of the Society. Besides the requirements of Canon 642, the candidate shall have the following qualities: (c) the emotional balance to live in community and work with others. (n. 42)

Venerable Father Founder, at your intercession may God help us to integrate our feelings in our personality. May we be open to how other people feel and show them the compassion you showed the world in sending your son, Jesus Christ. Amen.
