Week 09

'There are some who take the vow of poverty, but on condition that they do not suffer by it. At that rate, who would not gladly take such a vow? There would be no need to be a religious. One of the things I fear most would be to see the Society become rich. Then people place their confidence in their purse, not in God.' (FS 166:5-6)

'We must have the spirit of Mary, humble and hidden. She did more than the apostles by her prayers. Let us therefore unite silence and prayer with action. The Society of Mary desires that we, her children, should be missionaries of action, and missionaries of prayer.' (FS 190:3)

Week 11
